

Instructions for use

Catchmaster Vermin Trap 724

Contents of the package:

- Catchmaster Vermin Trap (Insect Traps) 724

Application:

1. **Unpacking:** Carefully remove the insect traps from the packaging.
2. **Folding:** Fold the trap along the lines provided to achieve an optimal shape for catching the insects.
3. **Activation:** Remove the protective film from the sticky surfaces of the traps to activate them.

Placement of the traps:

4. **Site selection:** Select areas where you have frequently observed insects.

Suitable locations include:

- Near kitchen appliances and cabinets
- Under sinks and near water pipes
- In corners and dark hiding places
- In pantries and storage rooms

5. **Positioning:** Place the traps folded or flat on the floor. Make sure that the traps are not blocked by household items or furniture.

The openings of the trap should point in the direction in which the insects move.

Place at least one sticky trap in each corner.

For larger rooms, we recommend also distributing some sticky traps along the long sides of the room.

Important: Keep the area as dust-free as possible, otherwise the adhesive strength of the trap may deteriorate more quickly.

Monitoring and maintenance:

- **Regular inspection:** Check the traps regularly for trapped insects.
- **Removal and replacement:** Replace the traps when the adhesive surface is no longer sticky or many insects are trapped.

Safety instructions:

- **Children and pets:** Keep the trap out of the reach of children and pets to avoid ingestion or contact with the adhesive surface.
- **Handling the trap:** Wear gloves when handling the traps to avoid direct contact with the adhesive surface.
- **Contact with food:** Do not place traps directly on or near food to prevent contamination.

Waste disposal:

- **Trapped insects:** Dispose of used traps with trapped insects in household waste. Use gloves to avoid direct contact.
- **Defective traps:** Dispose of damaged traps or traps that are no longer sticky in an environmentally friendly manner in household waste.
